Preparation of Manuscripts

Manuscripts should be between 4500 and 8000 words in length (including references, tables and figures). It is important that the file be saved in the native format of the MS-Word. The text should be in single-column format. Keep the layout of the text as simple as possible. Manuscript should be 'spell checked' and 'grammar checked'. All references mentioned in the Reference List are cited in the text, and vice versa.

Manuscripts should be prepared according to APA, 6th ed., except for the additional requirement of numbering the sections, as described below.

Subdivision - numbered sections Divide your article into clearly defined and numbered sections. Subsections should be numbered 1.1 (then 1.1.1, 1.1.2, ...), 1.2, etc. (the abstract is not included in section numbering). Use this numbering also for internal cross-referencing: do not just refer to 'the text'. Any subsection may be given a brief heading. Each heading should appear on its own separate line.

Introduction State the objectives of the work and provide an adequate background, avoiding a detailed literature survey or a summary of the results.

Methodology Give detail description about the methods used for data collection, processing and analysis.

Results and Discussion Results should be clear and concise. Discussion should explore the significance of the results of the work, not repeat them. Avoid extensive citations and discussion of published literature.

Conclusions The main conclusions of the study may be presented in a short Conclusions section, which may stand alone or form a subsection of a Discussion or Results and Discussion section.

Abstract A concise and factual abstract is required (maximum 150 words). The abstract should state briefly the purpose of the research, the principal results and major conclusions. Non-standard or uncommon abbreviations should be avoided, but if essential they must be defined at their first mention in the abstract itself.

Keywords Immediately after the abstract, provide a maximum of 5 keywords, using British or American spelling, but not a mixture of these, and avoiding general and plural terms and multiple concepts (avoid, for example, "and", "of").

Artwork Electronic Make sure you use uniform lettering and sizing of your original artwork. Embed the used fonts if the application provides that option. Number the illustrations according to their sequence in the text. Provide captions to illustrations separately. Submit each illustration as a separate file. Please 'Save as' or convert the images to TIFF or JPEG formats. Color or grayscale photographs (halftones), keep to a minimum of 300 dpi.

The review process will take 60 days from last date of submission of manuscript and results of review will be mailed to your registered e-mail id. 15 days will be given to submit the replies to the comments of reviewer and after the satisfaction of reviewer the paper will be published both online and in hardcopy.
